

100 Years Ago at St. Paul's Parish
June, 1914

For several years the June issue of the Parish Record has contained brief outlines or fuller reports of the work done in the various guilds and societies, including the Treasurer. The issue has served the purpose of the more pretentious year books which are issued by some parishes.

Report of the Sunday School, with an average attendance of 138 and 22 teachers. The Roll of Honor indicates that the pupil has attended the church service at least once each Sunday. Attendance at church is emphasized as part of the regular life of the child. The regular course of graded lessons has been taught with an examination at the end of the year. Many of our teachers have called upon their pupils; have invited them for an afternoon or evening of pleasure, or given some little personal gift. One teacher took all the boys home to breakfast with her. All this thoughtful kindness serves to bind teacher and pupil together and increases the influence of the teaching on Sunday.

The Young Women's Auxiliary

The time until Christmas was spent in dressing dolls to go in our Christmas box, to which each member contributed toys also. This box was sent to Hickory, N.C. After Christmas a quantity of infant clothing was made.

The Girls' Friendly Society

We try to carry out the motto of the Society by bearing one another's burdens in various ways. Such work as mutual help, friendship, the upholding of the purest and highest standards of womanhood; they can never be fully known, but they can many times be felt. We have two classes directly after school for girls 5 to 12 years of age and for girls 12 to 16 years. It is a society for all girls, rich or poor, learned and unlearned, a band of women and girls in one society for mutual help (religious and secular), for sympathy and prayer, and to encourage purity of life.
