Vestry Meeting Minutes
March 19, 2026 – 5 p.m.

The meeting began at 5:30 p.m. Greta began the meeting with an opening prayer.

February 2026 Financial Report: Discussion of the February 2025 Financial Report was tabled until the April meeting.

New Business:

1. Celtic Spirituality/Anam Cara Sojourners

The Rev. Kim Hardy and The Rev. Dr. Fred Moser recently retired from priestly positions at local parishes; they have been worshipping at CCSP since their retirement. As part of their work at these parishes, they facilitated a program they developed focusing on Celtic Spirituality named Anam Cara Sojourners. The program facets include, but are not limited to, the following components:

- a. Spiritual Liturgies
- b. Holy Hikes
- c. Pilgrimages to Ireland

They wish to continue this ministry in their retirement and have expressed the desire to base/offer these programs at CCSP. They also request to transfer the existing program financial assets (approximately \$4,000) to CCSP to cover expenses related to the program. After discussion, Miriam Burns made a motion to allow the movement of the Anam Cara Sojourners ministry and the related financial assets to CCSP and that a line item be established in the CCSP financials to account for these monies and any related expense; Shannon Williamson seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Task Force for Redevelopment Project

Greta introduced the idea of convening a task force for the redevelopment project. The focus of this task force would be to move forward on the various aspects of finalizing the redevelopment project, including, but not limited to, the sale of the property on the Pearl Street and the larger redevelopment project with Stewardship Realty. Greta circulated a list of potential task force members comprised of trustees, Vestry leadership, and members at large for the Vestry to review. Other names were brought forth by Vestry members and added to the list. After discussion, Barrie Montross made a motion authorizing Greta to move

forward with contacting individuals to determine their interest in serving on this task force and to convene the first meeting; the motion was seconded by Jenny Sisk. The motion carried unanimously.

3. Treasurer Replacement

In light of Peter Jones' resignation as Treasurer, Greta solicited input from the Vestry on people who might be interested in and/or qualified to serve as Treasurer. Greta noted Peter is willing to assist with the transition to a new Treasurer and will work with whoever agrees to take on the role. Greta stated any names be submitted to either her or Jennifer Sumner.

Greta stated Peter's resignation would be announced in the Enews this week (March 20th edition); a request for persons interested in serving the Treasurer role would be in the Enews beginning on March 27th.

Executive Session: The meeting went into Executive Session to discuss various matters related to the recent parish vote on the redevelopment project.

After the Executive Session concluded, Susan led a closing prayer. The meeting adjourned at 6:55 p.m.
